5. Exhibits of Flowers, Fruit and Vegetables **must be the produce of the Exhibitor's own garden unless otherwise stated.**
6. Exhibits of Cookery and Preserves are to be the unaided work of the Exhibitor.
7. All exhibits must be staged between 9 am - 10.30 am on Saturday 4 September, after which the hall will be cleared for judging.
8. The Committee cannot be held responsible for any entry lost or damaged.
9. Entrance fees:- Children Only classes - free. All other classes – 20p per entry.
10. We regret that **NO ENTRIES** can be accepted on the day. Please ensure you have correctly entered the categories on your application form as errors cannot be rectified on the day.
11. The decision of the judges shall be final.

## **SPECIAL INSTRUCTIONS**

### **RECIPE**

(This recipe to be used for item 55 – Class 9)

#### **MARY BERRY'S SWISS ROLL**

##### **For the cake:**

3 large eggs (at room temperature), 3oz (75g) caster sugar (warmed),  
3oz (75g) self-raising flour

##### **Filling:**

caster sugar, about 4 tablespoons raspberry jam

Preheat oven to 425F/220C/gas mark 7. Grease and line with greased greaseproof paper, a Swiss roll tin 13 x 9 inches (32.4 x 22.5cm).

Whisk the eggs and sugar together in a large bowl until mixture is light and creamy and the whisk leaves a trail when lifted out. Sieve the flour and carefully fold it, with a metal spoon, into the mixture.

Turn the mixture into the tin, give it a gentle shake or smooth level with the back of a spoon, making sure it is spread evenly into the corners. Bake in the oven for about 10 mins until the sponge is golden brown and begins to shrink from the edges of the tin.

Whilst the cake is cooking, cut a piece of greaseproof paper a little bigger than the tin and sprinkle it with caster sugar. Heat the jam in a small pan until it is of a consistency that is just easy to spread; if too hot it will soak into the sponge.

Invert the cake on to the sugared paper. Quickly loosen the paper on the bottom of the cake and peel it off. To make rolling easier, trim all 4 edges of the sponge and make a score mark 1 inch (2.5cm) in from the rolling edge, being careful not to cut right through.

Spread the cake with jam, taking it almost to the edges. Fold the narrow strip created by the score mark down onto the jam and begin rolling up, using the paper to keep a firm roll.

Leave for a few minutes with the paper still around it so that it will settle. Lift the Swiss roll onto a wire rack, remove the paper and sprinkle with more sugar and leave to cool.
